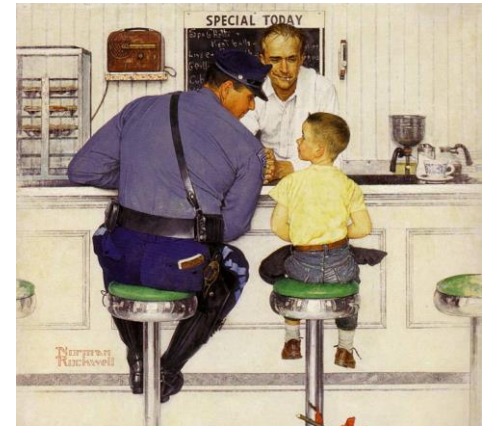

**Officer Angela Vance** is the LGBTQ Liaison Officer for the Cincinnati Police Department. Her role is to build communication between the LGBTQ community and the police department through trust and understanding. Her presentation will focus on Community Problem Oriented Projects and identify problems and strengthen relationships between the community and police.

**Officer Lisa Johnson** is the Quality of Life Enhancement Officer with the Cincinnati Police Dept. She works on Community Problem Oriented Projects with Neighborhood Liaison Officers to identify problems and strengthen relationships between police and the communities served.

**Kim Kehl** is the Trauma-Informed Project Coordinator of the Ohio Mental Health and Addiction Services. His presentation will focus on the impact of trauma, the principles of trauma-informed approaches and healing and recovery. Their adverse childhood experiences a person has correlates directly with health and social issues that occur later in life.

**Joseph Pinjuh** is the Assistant U.S. Attorney for the United States Attorney's Office for the Northern District of Ohio. His areas of expertise and specialization are Title III prosecutions, complex, multi-defendant narcotics prosecutions, community-based gang prosecutions and community outreach. His presentation will focus on various approaches to the heroin and fentanyl problem, including the creation of Heroin Involved Death Investigation Teams. Also, this program will focus on prosecution responses to the heroin problem at the state and federal levels.

**Venica Miller** is the Deputy Director of Support and Outreach Services of the Ohio Attorney General's Crime Victim Services Section. She coordinates and oversees administrative support, intake, training, special events and outreach activities for the unit. She is a certified OPOTA Instructor. Her presentation will focus on the affect drug addiction has on people who have fallen victim to crime. Discuss how vulnerable people who are often homeless youths and victims of human trafficking and domestic violence who are struggling with addiction are more susceptible to victimization and less likely to report the crime.

**Robin Mathews, LISW** is a Senior Assistant Attorney General in the Crime Victim Services Section. Prior to joining the Ohio Attorney General's Office, she was an Associate Legal Counsel with the Ohio Department of Public Safety. She spent majority of her 20+ years in public service with the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services. She has her Bachelors and Masters degrees in Social Work. Her presentation will continue to focus on Venica Miller's topic.

**Sandra Huntzinger, MSW** is the Victim Service Coordinator for the Ohio Attorney General's Sexual Assault Forensic Exam Program. She manages a \$3.5 million reimbursement program for sexual assault evidence collection kits and has expanded the program by offering technical assistance and training on sexual assault and domestic violence intervention. Her presentation will follow up on the same topic as Venica and Robin.

**Jeffrey Scott** is the Chief of Police for Notre Dame College Police Department in South Euclid, Ohio. A 21 year law enforcement veteran, he is a graduate of the Law Enforcement Foundation's Police Executive Leadership College and Certified Law Enforcement Executive programs as well as the FBI National Academy. He is an OPOTA Certified Instructor and active in law enforcement education and leadership trainings. His presentation will focus on the Below 100 Program that ensures officers are keeping safe and avoiding the pitfalls that lead to serious injury and death.

**Victor McDowell** is a Lieutenant with the Cleveland Metroparks Ranger Department. He is the Independent Contractor-Facilitator for The Diversity Center of Northeast Ohio and provides trainings for cultural competence and inclusion trainings along with expertise in law enforcement. His presentation will focus on Restorative Justice Peace Circle Practices and foster healthy relationships and community engagement. Critical thinking and bias reduction strategies will be utilized.

**Keysha Myers** is the Cognitive Behavioral Therapist Group Facilitator/Case Manager Intervention Evaluating Specialist for Summit County Juvenile Court. She is Co-Chair of the Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative Sub-Committee. She coordinates and facilitates restorative justice trainings and collaborates among juvenile justice agencies. Her presentation will focus on how the effects of trauma, poverty and stress impact adolescent brain development and will learn methods to improve interactions with community youth.

**Rae Grady** is the Prevention and Education Specialist for the Lake County ADAMHS (Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services.) She has served as the Coordinator of the Lake County Suicide Prevention Coalition for the last 10 years and the Trauma Response Team for the last 3 years. She has facilitated over 50 debriefings with first responders. She has an M.Ed. in Counseling. Her presentation will focus on Adolescent Depression and Suicide covering the symptoms, risk factors, warning signs and how to help adolescents.
