Association Preamble

We, the members of the Ohio Police
Juvenile Officers' Association bind
ourselves together under Divine
guidance to establish this constitution
for the betterment of humanity through
united action and the fostering of the
best practices and procedures in the
handling of juveniles and those
committing offenses against them.

The OPJOA was founded in 1961 in
Columbus, Ohio with the goal of
bringing together officers throughout
the State of Ohio to improve the
techniques of handling and counseling
youths involved in law violations and
the parents of such youths. The
statewide organization was to be the
means of fostering study and
exchanging of ideas and methods used
in dealing with youth offenders. Over
the years, the OPJOA has become open
to persons interested in the field of
handling youth and who subscribe to
the purposes and objectives of the
organization.

Joe Di Lillo - is the Public Information Officer for the South Euclid Police Department. He has been in Law Enforcement for 14 years, beginning with the Put-in-Bay Police Department in 2005, before moving to South Euclid in 2006. In 2015, Officer Di Lillo joined EDGE (Eastside Departments Group Enforcement) as a Hostage Negotiator. In that time, Di Lillo and the EDGE Negotiation Unit have encountered suicide jumpers, homicidal males, barricaded bombing suspects, and more. As well as the spokesman, Officer Di Lillo assists the SEPD Youth Academy, orchestrates the department social media page, & serves as the SRO for the South Euclid Lyndhurst School District.

Monique Doll - was a police officer at the Anchorage Police Department- in Anchorage, Alaska for over 23 years. She has held positions as a patrol officer, undercover narcotics detective, task force officer for the federal Drug Enforcement Administration, task force officer for the Internal Revenue Service, and homicide detective. She has been an instructor at the Anchorage Police Academy, the Anchorage Police Citizen's Academy, the Anchorage Police Youth Academy, DEA Undercover Operations, the FBI Citizen's Academy, the FBI National Academy Alumni, and several high schools throughout the state of Alaska.

Sandra Tenkku – is the Community Outreach Specialist at the Lake County ADAMHS Board. She holds a B.S. degree in Human Development and Family Studies from Bowling Green State University as well as an M.B.A. from North Central University. She has been working in the field of behavioral & social services for 15 years. She coordinates & leads the Lake County Suicide Prevention Coalition, the Trauma Response Team & the Community Alliance of Law Enforcement and Mental Health Services Committee. Before coming to the ADAMHS Board she was the Director of Housing Services at Extended Housing. Prior to Extended Housing, Sandra worked with people with behavioral health issues who were homeless & victims of domestic violence. She is a certified trainer in Mental Health First Aid, QPR, Signs of Suicide, & is trained in a number of other evidence-based programs.

Brandon Gardner - has a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Mount Union. He also holds a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Cincinnati. He was accepted to The Washington Center, in Washington DC, where he spent his final semester completing Master level courses, attending seminars & interning at the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). Brandon spent the next 8 years at the IACP supporting and building programs to advance public safety entities across North America. Brandon moved back home to work for the Department of Public Safety for the last 5 years as a Senior Advisor to the Director of Public Safety, Assistant Director to Ohio Homeland Security and currently oversees the northern operations for the Ohio Narcotics Intelligence Center.

Rick Steller - is the Forensic Supervisor for the Ohio Narcotics Intelligence Center. Rick oversees the day to day operations of the four ONIC forensic labs. He retired from the Grove City Police Department where he worked as patrol officer and a detective for 30 years. Rick worked on the Franklin County ICAC Taskforce for 9 years. Rick is certified by the State of Ohio as a Master Criminal Investigator, Certified Evidence Recovery Specialist in a Digital Environment and a Certified Master Evidence Technician. He is also certified through Cellebrite for digital and video forensics.

Michael D. Korach - retired, was with New Franklin PD from (1991 to 2010) and served as SWAT Negotiator (1993 to 2010) and Team Leader (2005 to 2010). He has advanced training from Basic Negotiator SWAT Training, Advanced Negotiator SWAT Training, CIT Advanced Training, OPOTA Critical Incident Debrief Training & OPTOA Peer to Peer Training.

Scott C. Robertson - retired, was with Fairlawn PD from 1989 to 2011. He also served with Metro SWAT from 1991 to 2007 and was the Team's Commander from 2001 to 2007. He has advanced training from LAPD Basic SWAT School, LAPD Advanced SWAT School, TEES Explosive Entry & Handler and Basic & Advanced Negotiator Class.

Michael Wright - joined the Wayne County Prosecutor team in May of 2018. He is assigned to the Juvenile Division & prosecutes juvenile delinquency and unruly cases in the Wayne County Juvenile Court. He received both a Juris Doctor, cum laude, and a Masters of Business Administration from the University of Akron, in 2015 and 2016, respectively. Upon being admitted to the Ohio Bar, he accepted a position with the Montgomery County Prosecutor's office in the Child Protection Unit where he represented Children Services on Abuse, Neglect & Dependency Cases. Immediately prior to joining Wayne County, Michael was an Associate Attorney at the firm Palecek, McIlvaine, Hoffmann, and Morse where he focused primarily on Family Law.

Jessica Musser - is a graduate from Heidelberg University in Tiffin, Ohio in 2005. She has a BA in Mental Health Psychology & has been working in the social service field in Wayne County for the last 17 years. Most of her background is working with juveniles. She started her career at Wayne County Children Services Board as a caseworker. She spent several years working with teenagers through foster care, adoption, independent living, and coping through traumatic events. She is currently a Victim/Witness Advocate at the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office. The majority of her caseload involves helping minors through cases such as Domestic Violence, Child Endangering, and Sexual Assault cases.
